



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Kelly Corsino — Singer, Songwriter, and Student of Life.



From Mobile, Alabama, Jon Miller has been steadily trailblazing a new style of positive country music that is undeniably his own. With his unique blending of New Thought concepts into a modern country setting, Jon is carrying a positive message to a whole new audience. In 2008 Jon had his first taste of chart success with "Choice," which became a #2 song on the Country Christian Weekly Charts for Danny Ray Harris. That song was also nominated for Song of the Year in the Inspirational Country Music Awards. 2008 also saw Jon selected as a finalist in



CMT.com's Music City Madness with his song "Let Me," which was also nominated for Country Song of the Year in the 2009 International Just Plain Folks Awards. He has opened shows for nationally-known artists, including Trace Adkins, Charlie Daniels, and Josh Turner. Recently, Jon released his fourth Nashville recording, *Blessin's & Lessons*. As a filmmaker, his "Tapestry" received an Honorable Mention for Best Music Video in the 2013 Posi Music Awards, and he has just completed a full-length documentary, *What is New Thought?*, exploring the question through interviews with important New Thought leaders. Jon intends to continue pursuing his dreams and entertaining people with his music and films.



SHERRY WILLIAMS is first and foremost a singer - the 14-karat variety. As a high school student from San Bernardino, she sang and toured with THE YOUNG AMERICANS, became a member of Disneyland KIDS OF THE KINGDOM, and worked with Roger Wagner and the UCLA CHOIR.

THE UNUSUAL WE, a group of ten energetic performers, came next, working in Las Vegas, Reno and Lake Tahoe. Debbie Reynolds was so impressed with the group she signed them to her nightclub act and concert tour. When THE UNUSUAL WE dissolved, Debbie kept Sherry in her act. Since then there have been numerous TV appearances, (The Tonight Show, The Glen Campbell Show, The Tom Jones Show, The Della Reese Show, Soul Train, etc.), recording sessions (El Chicano, Red Bone) and concert tours with Andy Gibb, Johnnie Ray, and the legendary Eddie Kendricks.

As a solo artist, Sherry then toured Indonesia, Singapore, Hong Kong, and Bangkok. Returning to the United States, Sherry acted in films and on television, and continued to work extensively in important jazz venues, nightclubs and festivals. In 1997, she released her first CD, *The Way You Love Me*, to rave reviews. Her second release, *A Taste Of Sherry*, was on the 2003 Grammy ballot and one of the songs was used in the soundtrack of the film THE CORE. In late 2003 she released *You Must Believe In Spring*, again to rave reviews. Sherry produces and hosts the ongoing *Jazz at The Merc* concert series in Temecula, is a regular performer at southland New Thought centers, and continues to be a much-in-demand jazz vocalist.

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


AL YANKEE organized his first rock band at age 14. In his 20s he toured for three years with the Stan Kenton Orchestra, followed by a year traveling with Harry Blackstone's Magic Show. Yankee then spent sixteen years in the US Air Force as staff composer, First Sergeant, and director of the "Jazz West" big band. Al has conducted productions of The Who's *Tommy* and *Man of La Mancha*, and has worked with such diverse acts as

Barry Manilow, Ray Charles, Roger Daltrey, Harry Connick, Jr., Johnny Mathis, Peter Cetera, and Bernadette Peters. He was honored with a room being named after him at the Hotel Oregon in McMinnville. His music has been commissioned by the Oregon Shakespearean Festival, Interlochen Arts Academy, the Count Basie Orchestra, the Monterey Jazz Festival, and published with Warner Brothers. He has created several jazz recordings, and his first full length New Thought CD, *All There Is*, was released in late 2010. Al is the owner of Legacy Artists, an entertainment production company based in Palm Desert. He has been a featured soloist with the Riverside Community CSL for a dozen years, and is also a regular performer at the Visions Center for Spiritual Living. Al is humbled by, and grateful for, this opportunity to share his love of music and New Thought philosophy.

BILL KILPATRICK (guitar) has played in pit orchestras for musical productions throughout Southern California since the early 1980s. More recently he has served as musical director for numerous shows in Temecula, Fallbrook, Murrieta, and Lake Elsinore, some of which include *Little Shop of Horrors*, *All Shook Up*, *The Wizard of Oz*, *Les Miserables*, *Jekyll & Hyde*, *Into The Woods*, *Sweet Charity*, and the White Rose production of *Jane Eyre, the Musical*, for which he also composed the score. Bill is much in demand as a multi-instrumentalist and arranger, having worked with such artists as Greg Walker (*Santana*, *The 5th Dimension*, *World Classic Rockers*) and Richard Carpenter (*A Tribute to Karen Carpenter*). During his tenure as guitarist with the Hour of Power Orchestra at the Crystal Cathedral, Bill also

played with a wide range of celebrities, including Amy Grant, John Tesh, Ann Margaret, The Oak Ridge Boys, Andy Griffith, Michelle Pilar and many more. In the past few years, he has had the pleasure of working with two other well-established stars in the entertainment world, Don Rickles and Petula Clark. Most recently, Bill has found himself writing and orchestrating with Jon Anderson, founder & beloved vocalist for the world renowned British progressive rock band, **YES**. One of the songs that has come out of this collaboration, "Surfing With God" can be seen on YouTube. Also in progress for Bill & Jon Anderson is "*Violin Stories*", a 7 movement orchestral ballet. Working with noted artist JC Baez, a DVD-Booklet is taking shape, with a release date to be announced.



BRUCE LETT (bass) was featured in an LA Times article which quoted him as saying: "I don't understand hating a particular style of music. You can get a rush playing any type, if it's done right." He should know--he works in bands that play funk, jazz-fusion, straight-ahead jazz, R&B, Dixieland, bossa novas and pop tunes. Born in Evansville, Indiana, he started his musical career in a rock and roll band in the 7th grade. That band became very successful. Bruce attended the University of Evansville for 2 years before transferring to North Texas State University

where he toured with the world famous **One O'Clock Lab Band** and won a performance competition playing the Dragonetti Bass Concerto with orchestra. After college Bruce remained in Dallas where he recorded hundreds of television commercials, jingles, and industrial films. He moved to Los Angeles in 1985 and has since toured and recorded with Nancy Wilson, Ernie Watts, Alphonse Mouzon, Richie Cole, Rosemary Clooney, etc. He has played for several TV shows and is heard on the theme music for *Americas Funniest Home Videos*. Bruce was featured in the 2008 documentary *Trying to Get Good: The Jazz Odyssey of Jack Sheldon* and is the long-time bassist for the house band at the Redondo Beach Center for Spiritual Living.



He has also performed with The Temptations, The Supremes, Red Foxx, and numerous other headline acts. As arranger/composer, he has written for orchestras, military bands, jazz ballets, chamber groups, and choral ensembles. His jazz CDs include "Turn," "Warm Valley," and "Fourth Stream."



His partner in music, business, and life is jazz vocalist Maria Katindig-Dykes, and their latest project together was 2010's "No More Blues" CD. Jimmie continues to find great joy in his position as Music Director for the Riverside Community Center for Spiritual Living, a position he has held for 20 years. He is most proud of his contributions as producer and musical director of the Center's fundraising galas: "Raise the Roof" and "The Return of the Real Big Band."

BOB MARINO (drums) comes from a long line of professional musicians and has been one himself since the tender age of 14. His Broadway credits include: *Kiss of the Spider Woman*, starring Vanessa Williams; *Sunset Blvd.*, starring Glenn Close, and; *Hello Dolly*, starring Nell Carter and Joanne Worley. National Tours include: *Jerry Lewis-Unlimited*; *Ben Vereen & Leslie Uggams On Broadway*; *The Three Tenors* (Rome); *Harry Blackstone* (5 years); *Don Rickles & Joan Rivers-In Concert*; *Andrea Bocelli*, and; *The Ringling Brothers, Barnum & Bailey Circus*. Bob has had the pleasure of accompanying some of the greatest entertainers in the business including: Mel Torme, Andy Williams, Henry Mancini, Steve Allen, Lionel Ritchie, Savion Glover, Quincy Jones, John Raatt, Peggy Lee, John Denver, George Burns, Jerry Herman, Carol Channing, Steve Lawrence, Eydie Gorme, Shirley Jones, Joe Marino, Merv Griffin, Toni Tennille, Robert Morse and many others. He has played drums, percussion, conducted, musically directed, technically designed, and/or produced over 300 large scale musical productions.
